Offering of Pearl

Each woman present manifest their agency through their offerings. Invoking all Buddhist women across time, we illuminate the Jewel-Net of our interdependence. Recognizing ourselves in this precious womb, each a precious pearl of luminous beauty, we pass the pearl one to another as we see each other deeply through the heart. We are each unique, with specific qualities and characteristics. This is our perfection. We are one bright pearl like the natural pearl we offer around the circle before offering it to Prajnaparamita.

"One bright pearl is able to express Reality without naming it, and we can recognize this pearl as its name. One bright pearl communicates directly through all time; being unexhausted through all the past, it arrives through all the present. While there is a body now and a mind now -- they are the bright pearl. That stalk of grass, this tree, is not a stalk of grass, is not a tree; the mountains and rivers of this world are not the mountains and rivers of this world. They are the bright pearl.... All the universe is one bright pearl."
